Rosedale Block Captains Wrap Up the Year!

More than 30 Rosedale block captains met on Sunday, Oct. 15 at the GRDC office, 19800 Grand River, to hear the latest on fire safety and pick up some free smoke detectors; to learn more about how to track down property managers and property owners; reasons to join our Rosedale Radio Patrol; and highlights of upcoming neighborhood special events, including the Holiday Pancake breakfast on Dec. 9, the Annual Gala on Jan. 20, 2024, and a new event, the Harvest Hayride, on Oct. 29.

Lt. Stacey Taylor of the Detroit Fire Department Community Relations Department gave out free smoke detectors with lithium batteries and reminded all in attendance about the hazards of using space heaters, slow cookers, heating pads, and generators. Lt. Taylor also emphasized the dangers of barbecuing on porches, whether front porches or back porches. Jill Laufer, block captain on Warwick and a veteran member of the Vacant Property Task Force, gave a short presentation on how to track down ownership information about homes in the neighborhood, as well as finding property managers for rental properties.

Rosedale Radio Patrol President Trajan Centers gave a recruitment pitch for everyone to join our volunteer civilian radio patrol—a commitment of only two hours per month, on a day and time of your choosing. To express an interest in joining, send an email to rpradiopatrol@gmail.com.

RPIA Treasurer Ivan Johnson reported on the winding up of our \$5,000 Huntington beautification grant, which supports the many volunteers throughout Rosedale Park who invest their creativity and time in making our islands beautiful.

Tasty refreshments kept everyone's energy up—the group will take a winter break and re-convene in February 2024.

Snow Season is Coming!

Winter is on the way and if the last few years are any indicator, we can expect to see 2–3 snowstorms in our area over the winter season. Part of Rosedale's annual dues pays for the yearly snow contract. (Thank you duespaying members!) This is a separate service from city snow plowing. Our private contractor will clear the streets when we receive three inches of snow accumulation, typically

between the months of December and April. When a big storm is predicted, please make sure to move cars and trash containers from the street. It can be difficult to maneuver a snow plow down a street that is blocked by parked cars, especially if there are traffic islands on the street. Please look out for neighborhood text reminders that go out when plows are expected to be in the neighborhood.
