

Safety Corner With the Radio Patrol

'Tis the season to be jolly, but it's also crucial to stay vigilant to ensure the safety of our homes and loved ones during the festive period. As the President of the Rosedale Park Radio Patrol, I'd like to share some safety tips to help protect our community from potential holiday risks including package theft and burglaries.

- 1. Secure Your Deliveries: With the rise of online shopping, doorstep package theft has become a common concern. To safeguard your deliveries, consider having them sent to a secure location like a neighbor's house or a designated package locker. Alternatively, schedule deliveries when you know you'll be home or use tracking apps to stay informed about the delivery status.
- 2. Create the Illusion of Presence: Make your home appear occupied even when you're away. Use timers for lights and electronic devices to give the impression that someone is home. Consider investing in smart home technology that allows you to control lights and security systems remotely. This can deter potential burglars by making it seem like someone is actively managing the property.
- **3. Neighbor Watch:** Inform your neighbors if you will be going out of town for the holidays, and ask your neighbors to keep an eye on your home. That way, they will report any suspicious activity instead of assuming you're home.
