To do this we will all need to pull together as one united community. There are several challenges facing us, vacant homes maintenance, crime, foreclosures to name a few items. In addition, we are experiencing a decline in operating capital for the association due to the decline in the number of residents paying their dues. Yet, we remain optimistic that we can improve in these areas. Several initiatives have and will occur that will target addressing the above areas. Your help when those initiatives are launched, as an R.P.I.A. community resident, will be needed in order for things to improve. I look forward to working with you on these endeavors.

Regarding Paid Security Patrols

As stated in the dues letter, mailed to every home in November, if sufficient funds were not received to cover the contract amount for the entire year, we would not reactivate the paid security patrol contract. I am sorry to say that based on the current inflow of security assessment payments, it does not appear that the contract will be renewed. The final decision will occur in March after the second dues/security payment request is mailed and the resulting payments tallied. I can only say that it is in your hands whether we increase the level of security patrols for the community. Your voice will be heard by the receipt of your assessments. This does not mean that we will not continue to look for and take advantage of any available programs that will address the issue of crime within our community. We are ever looking for public programs we can engage in to address this issue. However, ultimately it is your active participation in the abatement of crime that will curtail and/or eliminate it from our community.

Changing of the Seasons

It is hard to believe that spring will soon be upon us. As you start making your list of things to do to spruce up your homes and surrounding landscape, keep in mind that we are a designated historical district. This means that there are restrictions on the types of changes that you are permitted to make to your dwelling. Check first to see what you are and are not permitted to change and what permits are required. We don't want anyone to invest capital and time on a project, only to be stopped because it does not fit within the restrictions of maintaining the historical nature of the premise.

If you reside in a home in Rosedale Park, ask yourself, what is at least one thing I can do to help improve the community? Once you have decided what that activity will be, act on it!

This information is taken from the US Census 2010 Committee mailing. Their goal is to get all residents of the City of Detroit and the state of Michigan to fill out their Census Form which will be mailed to our addresses in March 2010.

Why is it important to count everyone living in the U.S.?

diversity of people living in an area. Thus, a complete count gives the US government an accurate picture of our communities and what it is that we need. Over the next ten years until the next Census an accurate count can mean trillions of dollars for our State and communities.

Should undocumented immigrants fear being counted?

First, the Constitution requires this to be done every 10 years and 2010 is our year. Every person counted earns funding and resources for their community. This funding depends on the numbers we turn in. A complete count helps business based on the number and

It does not ask about immigration status nor for any identifying information such as social security numbers. Further, Census Bureau employees face severe penalties (\$250K) and prison for disclosing anything from the Census forms. The bonus: filling out and returning your form promptly ensures that census workers need not come to your home and knock on your door! (They may come up to 6 times to try and collect information.)

Many mistakenly believe that the Census isn't meant to include or affect them.

The Census counts everyone in the United States. You need to help your community, City and State. An accurate count helps government agencies and businesses understand the full cultural and language diversity of our community and provide appropriate services from stores, emergency services, senior services, roads, hospitals, parks to mention a few.

So, in March 2010, fill out your simple 10 question Census 2010 right away and mail it in right away and let's get on with the business of making our City and State and community all that we can be!

RENTAL PROPERTIES IN OUR NEIGHBORHOOD

As many of our residents have already noticed, there has been an increase in the number of renters in our community. Property owners should be aware that just as homeowners are required to pass housing inspections to sell their homes, there are inspection requirements and responsibilities that landlords must abide by in order to

rent their properties.

Owners of rental property must register each rental property with the City of Detroit Department of Building and Safety Engineering – that includes houses, apartments, or single rooms. A Certification of Registry will be provided to the owner which must be posted on the premises of the dwelling. Along with the registration, the house must undergo an annual inspection. The inspections are conducted to make sure the home is in compliance with the City of Detroit Property Maintenance Code, the Zoning Ordinance, and other ordinances. These rules are important to both the owners and tenants. They help improve property value around our neighborhoods, and keep the rental houses safe and desirable for residents.

GRDC wants to make sure that every rental in our community abides by these important rules. If you know of any rental property on your street, please contact Simon Wang, GRDC intern, at 313-387-4732 ext. 104, so that he can check to determine if the houses are on the City's rental registry list.

VACANT HOUSE ALERT

Do you have any vacant houses on your block? If so, please give GRDC Intern Simon Wang a call at 313-387-4732, ext. 104, and tell him the address. GRDC, in cooperation with all of the neighborhood associations, is trying to keep track of all of the vacancies and we need your help! President Deborah Gore called the meeting to order at 7:15pm.

Board Meeting Guest

Bonnie Mead introduced herself to those board members who did not know her. She will be taking on the position of newsletter editor in the interim until a replacement is found.

Financial Summary

Vicki provided the financial summary and the board reviewed it, compiling a list of needed adjustments to be discussed at a later date. Acceptance of the report is pending further review and discussion.

Block Captains' Event

The board discussed the final preparations needed for the Block Captain's event on Sunday, January 17th. A final RSVP list will be compiled by Saturday, January 16th. Carolyn passed out an updated list of houses that appear to no longer be vacant in Rosedale Park. One objective during the block captain meeting is to pass the list to the block captains and ask them to find out if the homes are occupied and obtain updated contact information for the homes on their particular blocks. This effort is an attempt to properly identify the vacant homes in Rosedale Park. The board reviewed other agenda items and the block captain's role in the community.

Annual Banquet

The board reported that the caterer and the entertainment have been finalized. Each board member committed to attempting to sell 10 tickets to the banquet. Representatives from the Detroit City Council have committed to attending and participating in the swearing-in ceremony for the 2010 RPIA Board Members.

Board Meeting Dates/Attendance

The board discussed making sure that the dates of the board meeting worked for all due to low attendance at recent meetings. It was stressed that if a member has a prior commitment that falls on the same day as a board meeting, they were asked to keep contact with another board member for notes.

Potential Board Members/Volunteers Needed

A board position had recently opened with the resignation of Sonya Pouncy. Sonya recently resigned due to prior commitments. This leaves the volunteer position of newsletter editor vacant as well as the newsletter distribution position left vacant by Kevin Kelly last year. Bonnie Mead attended the board meeting agreeing to stand in as the newsletter editor until a replacement is found. Darryl Brown will be working with Adrienne Jordan on selling ad space for the newsletter. The board will continue to discuss the needs to fill the open volunteer positions and increase efforts to find replacements for each.

The board discussed reviewing the qualifications of potential board members and additional skill sets that would be helpful in carrying out future board duties.

Radio Patrol - Proposed Integration w/Grandmont

Representatives from the Grandmont area approached RPIA in an effort to combine the two radio patrol stations. It was the consensus of many board members that this integration would not be in the best interest of Rosedale Park due to the size of the area and the lack of volunteers available to patrol.

Vacant Homes in Rosedale Park

Darryl informed the board about a group called 'Rebuilding Detroit Together' that the board may be interested in partnering with for the vacant house effort. Carolyn discussed the partnership with GRDC to place lights on vacant houses and provide services to board up vacant homes that pose a problem for the community.

RPIA Website

Deborah reported that the website is near to completion and the rest of the board will be able to review it in the near future. The due date is proposed for the end of the month.

Joint Efforts with North Rosedale Community

A number of board members proposed having joint efforts with the North Rosedale community in some instances. Combining a certain number of efforts such as events and the newsletter may be more beneficial due to shrinking communities and the economic situation at hand. Any joint ventures would have to ensure that they would work in the best interest of continuing to maintain the separate identities of the two communities.
