Large Ruts Around Rosedale Filled In

RPIA Treasurer Frank Rabin and Rosedale Neighbors Katalin and Jeff Daigle placed three large boulders to fill deep ruts at two spots in Rosedale – both sides of the entrance off Fenkell into the Grandland Plaza near Rite Aid, and from the alley heading east behind Chase Bank onto Ashton. They first filled the ruts with crushed limestone before placing the boulders on top. They used \$60 of the generous beautification grant from Huntington Bank for the project.

Frank, Katalin and Jeff spread six yards of mulch at the "Welcome to Rosedale Park" entrance on the island at Outer Drive and Grand River, plus the space at the triangle landscape bed where Grand River and Fenkell meet, in front of the cell phone store.

Daffodil Bulbs Planted

Floriculturists from the City of Detroit GSD Landscape Design Unit planted over 1 million daffodil bulbs in parks, lots, and islands throughout the city in the past couple of years. In Rosedale Park, they planted 42 thousand daffodils on the islands on Ashton, Rosemont, Warwick, Glastonbury, Faust, and Greenview. The bulbs are loaded into a hopper and a tractor pulls the Bulb Transplanter that automatically plants the bulbs. Watch for many blooms next spring!
