# 2025 Huntington Beautification Grant for Rosedale Park!

Huntington Bank continues to invest in Detroit neighborhoods in a big way—they recently awarded a \$25,000 beautification grant, to be divided equally among the five Grandmont Rosedale neighborhoods. This is the sixth year Rosedale Park has received \$5,000 from this generous Huntington grant to help us beautify our surroundings.

RPIA is pleased to put those funds to work in an island beautification program, to give a 100% matching grant to any block that invests up to a maximum of \$150 to make their island beautiful. Eligible expenses include dirt, mulch, grass seed, flowers, perennials, shrubs, landscape blocks, tools, fertilizer, weed killer, boulders, seeds, flowerpots, stakes,



etc. Grants will be given on a first-come, first-served basis, with an August 1st deadline for submitting hard-copy printed receipts.
